However, these studies have predominantly focused on broad linguistic families, leaving a gap in understanding specific to English and its interactions with less-studied languages.

Cultural Linguistics. The field of cultural linguistics, especially the works focusing on cultural conceptualizations and language, has contributed significantly to understanding how language reflects cultural cognition. Researchers like Farzad Sharifian [9] have provided insights into cultural schemas and their linguistic representations. Yet, the specific exploration of how these schemas result in lexical lacunae in English remains an area ripe for further investigation.

Cognitive and psycholinguistic approaches. Cognitive linguistics, particularly in the works of George Lakoff [11] and others, has explored the relationship between language, thought, and culture. These studies have opened avenues for understanding how language shapes cognitive processes. However, the specific cognitive impact of lexical lacunae, and how English speakers navigate these gaps, is a less charted territory.

Translation studies and cross-cultural communication. There is a growing body of work in translation studies addressing the challenge of translating untranslatable words. Scholars like Mona Baker and Susan Bassnett have delved into strategies for handling cultural and linguistic gaps. Despite these advancements, the practical methodologies for addressing lexical lacunae in translation and communication remain underdeveloped.

With the advent of computational linguistics, there has been progress in identifying and cataloguing lexical gaps using digital corpora and machine learning. However, the integration of these technological methods with cultural and cognitive insights is still in its infancy.

This study has offered an examination of lexical lacunae in the English language, providing insights into their origins, implications, and the challenges they pose in communication and understanding. Key conclusions drawn from this research are:
